3: September 9-11, 1984

In 1984, BIRD OBSERVER and the BROOKLINE BIRD CLUB will sponsor three unusual TWO-DAY PELAGIC TRIPS to the edge of the CONTINENTAL SHELF, leaving from GLOUCESTER aboard YANKEE CAFTS, a fully equipped 100-foot ship, on SUNDAY at 7 P.M., returning by 7 P.M. TUESDAY. Accommodations are simple bunks in an open dormitory setting.

The COST will be \$175, subject to a possible adjustment depending on fuel prices. These excursions are offered on a NON-PROFIT basis. We must confirm our dates with the ship company months in advance. Therefore, ADVANCE REGISTRATION is necessary. Each trip is limited to 40.

A DEPOSIT of \$50 before DECEMBER 1 will reserve a space on the JUNE TRIP. If you should cancel, \$25 of this deposit is not refundable. Deposits for the AUGUST TRIP should be made by JANUARY 1; for SEPTEMBER, by FEBRUARY 1.
