The present season has been remarkable for the absence of extremes in temperature, and though unusually moist the weather has been ideal for animal and plant-life. As a result of these conditions, and of the forces of conservation now at work, Birds have been more abundant than for many years.

Regardless of all changes and conditions, strict migrants like Bluebirds, swallows, and Warbler, follow the calendar closely, seldom showing a variation in time of spring arrival of over one week, and they frequently travel on 'schedule-time'; never, according to our records, do such differences in time extend to three weeks. Since the value of a local calendar depends entirely upon its accuracy, great care must be taken to identify every supposititious species, and all doubtful records should be eliminated.

Flocks of the beautiful Cedar Waxwing have been remarkably abundant, and were in force from the end of March to the end of April. On April 12 over one hundred spent an hour at the Biological Laboratory, where they were feeding on the dried berries of the *Ampelopsis veitchii*.
