FRANK M. CHAPMAN FUND

The Frank M. Chapman Fund gives grants in aid for ornithological research and also post-doctoral fellowships. RECORDS OF PERUVIAN PENGUINS WANTED

The Humboldt or Peruvian Penguin (*Spheniscus humboldti*) appears to be in danger of extinction because of human predation and disturbance. In order to assess the rate of decline, we appeal to ornithologists who have visited Peru to send us counts of this species. We are especially interested in counts from the Ballestas Islands near Paracas Bay. We would appreciate details such as numbers seen; time of day; weather; date; part of island observed; and thoroughness of observation.
