And Who Banded This One? Steve Fordham, Jr., of the Delmar Game Farm, Delmar, N. Y., writes that: "Miss E. L. Renaud, 23 Trull Street, Coboes, N. Y., got in touch with me and we both would like to get the complete banding information on bird banded 42-183217. The bird was captured in a screen porch on September 9, 1948, and released, species unknown, by her."

Charles Broley reports that heat has damaged young eagles this year. "This is the worst year. I will probably lose 75 out of 125 nests I have under observation and it will take all my time to get 60 birds as against 150 in 1936."

Banding Hint: Placing a false bottom trap (see Manual for Bird Banders 1947, p 31) vertically on a tree, the door facing up and a piece of suest on the false bottom, is a good way to trap downy woodpeckers successfully. By placing the same trap with the door facing down the trunk of the tree and sprung shut with a rubber band, you can capture brown creepers.
