## 23 RETURNS IN ONE WEEK By Arthur H. Fast

Arthur Fast, 4924 Rock Spring Road, Arlington, Virginia, reports the 23 returns tabulated below, at his home banding station, during the week January 4 to 10, inclusive, Many of these birds had attained an age worthy of note, including a White-throated Sparrow at least 7½ years of age, the oldest bird of that species to return to this station. Some of these returns also indicate that flocks stay together for several years. During that week, there was a veritable convention of birds banded at this station in previous years.
