T. Gilbert Pearson's "Birds of America" states that the Yellow-legs reasily attracted to decoys, hence a favorite with the gunners" (in the swhen it was a game bird). I found this to be true; in fact they seem days attracted to the trap when any kind of bird is in it. Although I to be attracted to this year, they were chronic repeaters, often together.
