## OPERATION RECOVERY -- OCEAN CITY, Md. -- 1962 By Gladys Cole

"Chiggers are about gone. Mosquitoes are more plentiful. Aubrey Bodine from Baltimore Sun came and took a few pictures. The Ballentines from West Virginia arrived. Poor, poor weather. Poor, poor birds. Only 31 new yesterday and as of 9:30 a.m. only 3 have been banded today. We need you to bring us some luck."

This was the news I received from Chan Robbins on September 5th, from Operation Recovery at Ocean City, Md. He had gone down on September 1st to set up the station. The next letter had better banding news.

I went down on September 13th with three helpers, arriving about 4 p.m. to find Chan Robbins and Jane Church with every collecting cage full of birds to be processed and it was time to make the rounds again. This was their second busy day and the best of the season. The next week was good banding when it wasn't raining:

Our station is quite primitive. We have a table for the scales, fashioned from a card table covered with a discarded metal top from someone's garden (but without the umbrella). A tarpaulin is tied between four trees for protection from sun and rain. We have movable cardboard boxes to protect scales from wind. Each worker brings his or her own chair. We had to park one block away this year as the spring hurricane had washed out the street which led into the station.

North Ocean City has changed in some ways since we have been banding there. A great many pine trees have died. Streets and houses have crowded nearer our station and close by this year was a dredge, pumping sand and muck from the bay to the beach on the ocean side. Despite this, you will see by our records that 1962 was the best year of our banding at this Operation Recovery station.
