Saturday afternoon: Workshop -- with tentative set-up as follows:

3. Banding Forum -- to run all afternoon with leaders changing every 45 minutes.
4. Decoys, baits and net sets.
5. First Aid to Projects Session.
6. Discussion of a possible cooperative banding project -- purpose being to get all banders working on a project.
