

## 1966 E. B. B. A. ANNUAL MEETING

The Editor's arrangements for complete coverage of the 1966 annual meeting fell through due to a series of misunderstandings, we regret to say.

But we have heard from many of those who attended (we were far away acting as 'best man' at our son Malcolm's wedding) that it was one of the best EBBA meetings ever -- and more members and guests attended than at any previous meeting except for the one at Cape May, N.J. in 1962.

"We greatly appreciate your encouragement in the March issue of 'Bird Banding Notes' for all banders to join banding associations. We hope this will continue in the future.

"We are also looking forward to the revised banding manual which you have indicated is presently being assembled."

A motion was made (Bell, seconded Gillespie) that the Frank Frazier, Sr. and Jr., be reappointed Editor and Co-editor of EBBA News for another year.

Council meeting adjourned at 11:00 P.M.
