WALK-IN GROUND TRAP

Simple ground trap, to be put
around main feeder station to trap
those ground feeders.

Height: 8 to 12"; diameter 12";
1/2" mesh wire; top door with
spring to remove birds from trap.

Have trapped White-throats,
Nuthatches, Cardinals - even a
Blue Jay squeezed through the
narrow entrance to get to seeds.
