WHO COLOR-MARKED A RED-TAILED HAWK?

Donald S. Heintzelman writes, "On October 22, 1966, at Bake Oven Knob, Lehigh County, Pa., I observed a color-marked Red-tailed Hawk passing low overhead. The bird, which was photographed in color, had a red or pink dye on the ventral (lower) surface of each wing and was obviously an experimental bird. I have checked with the Banding Office concerning records of persons color-marking this species but they have no information available."
