ANOTHER BANDING-BOX SUGGESTION By Frank P. Frazier. Jr.

The sketch and photograph show a banding-box I made for myself with a minimum of effort and while it was inspired by more elegant boxes which I have seen and which have been illustrated in EBBA News, the idea may be useful to other banders, particularly those who, like me, do not wish to construct a box from the outset.



It is simply a standard steel cashbox of the sort which can be found in office supply stores for about five dollars. Four holes are drilled in the lid to take 1/8" bolts to fix a heavy wire at the left and a notched angle (made of sheet steel or tin) at the right. Horizontal wires to hold bands are placed as shown; tape may be wound around the heavy wire to divide it, after the band-holding wires are in place. The box itself is divided (I used cardbeard and plastic tape for simplicity) to hold bands and tools.
