Many species were seen there under excellent weather conditions which do not occur in the north in this very unique southern setting of spanish moss laden trees. The air was exhilarating and despite the early morning exercise, everyone was fully alert during the paper session and business meeting which followed lunch.

The annual banquet was held at the Francis Marion Hotel at 8:00 P.M., where we also saw a presentation of Mr. John Henry Dick's "Alaskan Wildlife", an excellent slide lecture.

Sunday, May 2nd, consisted entirely of field trips. In the morning, Ted Beckett took us to the Francis Marion National Forest area to the Red-cockaded Woodpecker nesting territories which he is studying. Quite a caravan lined the road along one of our stops.
