NOT OLD ENOUGH ?

How old do birds get?
This is a question asked
by kids to their fathers,
who generally can only
guess at the answer. It is
a question which can best
be answered by the banders
who are in the unique position by having a whole

array of records before them. In 1946, Editor Geoffrey Gill examined the problem and a certain "standard" of maximum ages was compiled in EBBA News, Volume 9, Number 3 (March 1946).

This was over 25 years ago. Since then, the only, and quite recent tabulation of maximum ages which reached us, can be found in Research Report #30 (July 31, 1972) of the Powdermill Nature Reserve, by Robert C. Leberman and Mary H. Clench.

In the hope of establishing a new and refreshing line of communication between EBBA banders/members, we're starting another such project. We're sure that over the last 25 years, many new records have come to our attention; you need but check your records, they are at your fingertips.

In the following pages, you will find the tabulations we have found in the 1946 opus, and those Powdermill records which surpass the ages found in the former. Let's use this as a base list! Send me YOUR interesting age records! All records submitted will be published, showing the name of the bird, the date banded and recovered/returned, the age of the bird at time of banding and your name and address. Further, if your contribution is a new record, we will so indicate.

A word about the banding lab is in order here. You've all read Brian Sharp's article regarding checking of recoveries.

The editors of EBBA News are convinced that the Banding Lab. is doing everything possible to check all outgoing recoveries. It is understandible, however, that they could miss a few due to the fantastic workload, so we will keep checking those for publication in EBBA NEWS before we publish them.

Now's the time to get out your postcards, and start checking your records. Since I expect to get hundreds of these reports, I will not attempt to answer all records submitted by a return letter, except when you have questions or feel like chatting! Then, at the annual meeting at Island Beach, we can exchange some more notes on this subject.

Lastly, if you feel you would want to write an article concerning a particular record you may find, or recollect, by all means do so. That's what EBBA News is for. It is your magazine...and it is open to you for whatever you have to contribute.

In the compilation below, we've left off the addresses because the addresses on file here, date back to 1946, so in all probability, they are in error now. Powdermill records are marked with an asterisk (*).
