CUYAHOGA VALLEY NATIONAL PARK FALL CENSUS

The 2014 Fall Census in Cuyahoga Valley National Park was held on 20 Sep. The warm and sunny weather was a pleasant change from 21 Sep 2013 when it rained nearly all day. Fifty-one observers (the most ever for a fall census) formed 20 teams. Their 104 species was the tenth highest number in the last 22 years. This count included Alder Flycatcher and Prothonotary Warbler, which had not been seen before

on a fall census. The total number of individual birds seen was about average; individual counts of Chimney Swift and Red-bellied Woodpecker set record highs and Eurasian Starling set a record low.

The fall census started in 1983 but from then through 1997 the teams counted only species. In 1998, the census crews started counting individuals as well. Dwight began coordinating the census in 1992.
