PACIFIC COAST AVIFAUNA

No. 1. Birds of the Kotzebue Sound Region, Alaska, by Joseph Grinnell. 1900. 80 pp., 1 map. Price, \$.75 post paid.

An important contribution to our knowledge of Alaskan birds, the result of observations by the author covering more than a year in the region. The report consists of an "Introduction", "Field-notes", "Bibliography" and "Check-list". The "Field-notes" contain extended biographical accounts of rare northern species of birds that few people have had opportunity of meeting.

No. 4. Birds of the Huachuca Mountains, Arizona, by Harry S. Swarth. 1904. 70 pp. Price \$.50 postpaid.

Contains extended accounts of the life histories of interesting species of birds, including Mexican birds that enter the United States in only a few mountain ranges along our southern border. Based entirely upon observations by the author and his companions on field trips during several different years.
