This publication is mainly concerned with the manner of occurrence of the 409 species and subspecies of birds now credited to the Province of British Columbia. Beside the main list, there are supplementary lists, of introduced species and of species accredited to British Columbia on insufficient grounds, a bibliography of British Columbia ornithology, and an index. Introductory chapters deal with the life zones and faunal divisions of British Columbia, and with a historical sketch of ornithological work previously done in the Province. General style of treatment is as in Pacific Coast Avifauna No. 10.

This is the most elaborate and most thorough publication yet to appear, dealing with the birds of British Columbia. A copy should be in every library and on every ornithological study table in North America.
