The Morphology of the Syrinx in Passerine Birds. Peter L. Ames. 1971. Peabody Museum of Natural History, Bull. no. 37. 194 p. (price not given).— This bulletin reports the results of a detailed and technical examination and comparison of the syrinx, including both cartilaginous and muscular portions. The suborder Tyranni was given particular attention and the results suggest some significant changes in classification of several sub-oscine groups.

A Guide to the Birds of Ceylon.—G. M. Henry. 1971. Oxford Univ. Press, New York. 457 p. \$9.00. —The second edition of a field guide first published in 1955 has been enlarged and a few additional illustrations included. Species accounts include descriptions and field marks and notes on natural history and behavior. Illustrations include 27 colored plates and numerous black-and-white drawings; 309 of the 403 species are illustrated.
