





Birds of Fiji, Tonga and Samoa, is the first definitive account of the ornithology of this island region in the South-west Pacific, where there is a lack of and a growing demand for ornithological material. This book is based on Dr Watling's research and experience in the region and a thorough review of the literature.

There is a species account for each resident and regular migrant bird, with sections on identification-oriented descriptions, flight, voice, food, breeding and ecology. Distribution maps are an important identification aid.

The birds are magnificently illustrated on full colour plates by Chloë Talbot-Kelly, an internationally renowned ornithological artist. She has also prepared black and white text illustrations depicting special features. Photographs by Jim Siers, foremost Pacific photographer, illustrate the bird's habitat. There is a thorough Bibliography and three indices, which provide readers with easy access to any particular bird.
