Although it is published for the British Ornithologists' Union it is by no means exclusively British, and less than half the papers deal with British birds.

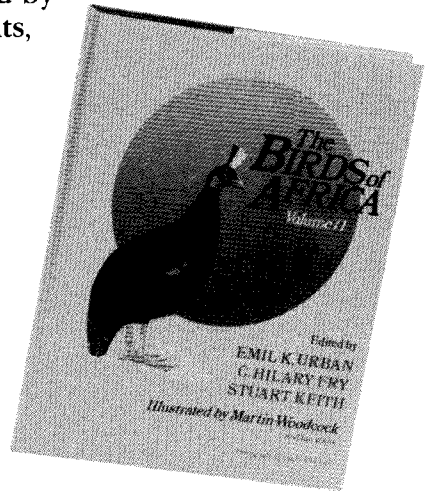

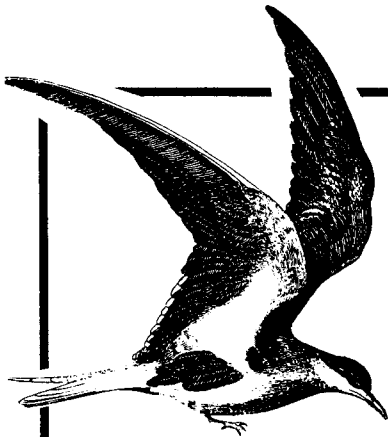
