



W.B.B.A. Two-Compartment Trap

This trap, measuring $7'' \times 8'' \times 10''$, is divided into two compartments each 5'' wide, 8'' high and 7'' deep; it is made of vertical wires similar to most bird cages.

Each compartment is provided with a drop door and automatic treadle of the type used on Potter traps. The treadles are attached to the trap and counter-balanced so that the doors will not be tripped by the jar of a bird alighting on the trap, or by the falling of the other door.

Adjustable feet are attached so that the trap will rest firmly on any approximately plane surface.

The trap is very strong, being welded throughout, and is painted with a good green enamel.


