



# REGIONAL BOUNDARY CHANGES ANNOUNCED

In a long-overdue effort to simplify the boundaries of several of the western Reporting Regions for American Birds' seasonal reports, several important changes have been made. These revisions have been under discussion for some time, and the decisions were made at a recent meeting (combining birding and business) in southern Arizona of Hugh Kingery, Guy McCaskie, Frances Williams and the Editor. Approval of the changes has also been communicated by Thomas Rogers and Gale Monson, of the other two affected Regions.

The most important change eliminates the impossibly complicated boundary through the middle of Colorado No longer will Colorado observers be in doubt as to where to send records: they all go to Kingery.

Following are the changes; maps are now being prepared and will begin to appear in this issue. Regardless of the maps, the changes are effective as of now; if you are in an area affected by these changes your Autumn Migration reports should be sent to your new Regional Editor or sub-editor.

MOUNTAIN WEST REGION (formerly Great Basin—Central Rocky Mountain Region) now includes the entire states of Utah, Wyoming, Colorado, and Nevada.

SOUTHERN GREAT PLAINS REGION. Loses eastern Colorado, and the eastern portion of New Mexico, gains the southwestern corner of Texas. This region will now embrace the entire states of Nebraska, Kansas, Oklahoma, and all of northern Texas. The boundary between this Region and the South Texas Region is unchanged.

SOUTHWEST REGION now adds the eastern portion of New Mexico and loses those portions of the California River Valley that are in California and the southwestern corner of Texas, and the southern corner of Nevada. The Region now comprises the entire states of Arizona and New Mexico.

THE ROCKY MOUNTAIN—INTERMOUNTAIN REGION now adds the southern half of Idaho, and the southern half of Oregon as far west as the present boundary of the Northern Pacific Region, which appears to be the ridge line of the Cascade Range.

THE SOUTHERN PACIFIC COAST REGION now includes all of California south of its border with the Middle Pacific Coast Region, which is unchanged.

It will be noted that although the new maps will not show it, border Regional Editors are now allowed to report exceptional records from the six adjacent states of Mexico, reflecting the greatly increased interest in this area. Reports affected by this change are Southern Pacific Coast Region (Baja California), Southwest Region (Sonora, Chihuahua) and South Texas (Coahuila, Nuevo Leon, Tamaulipas).
