Bob has been the leader of several successful ornithological tours; possesses an excellent knowledge of European birds and Greek birding areas; was director of the New Jersey Audubon Society; and his residence address is 755 Ross Lane, Bound Brook, New Jersey 08805.

### **The Wildflower and Herb Tour of Greece**

sponsored by the Herb Society of America, is offered at the height of the flowering season with Alta Dodds Niebuhr, the exuberant and knowledgeable leader. Alta was in charge of several Nature tours to Greece, authored the definitive "Herbs of Greece"; is a member of the Herb Society of America (South Texas unit) and the Garden Council (Austin area); and resides at Route 8, Box 280 C, Austin, Texas 78703.

Both tours are for a three-week period (April 26 to May 17, 1976). The tour dates are concurrent to allow couples or friends to travel together to Greece and be together in Athens and other locations utilized by both tours, although one may register for the Ornithological Tour and the other for the Wildflower and Herb Tour

The itineraries of both tours are carefully prepared to allow maximum exposure to the ornithological or horticultural interests of the participants; visits "to must" archaeological sites; meeting with local naturalists and environmentalists, either on field trips or during social functions; adequate leisure and shopping time; and to create an atmosphere of enjoyment, relaxation and friendship in the pursuit of common interests.

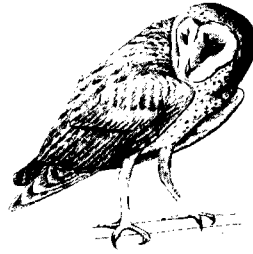
