The Master List of Bird Books for North American readers

In the first edition of this list (American Birds, 25:914, 1971) the Master List was compiled from the selections designated by seven authorities on birds, each of whom was asked to choose his basic list of 25 books. To include those titles mentioned by more than one selector, and to add those that seemed to us important but overlooked, a list of 60 titles finally emerged. This year, the list stands at 65 titles, and it includes 20 titles not present in the first list, some new, some added as a result of further evaluation. Several books listed previously are now in later editions or have had additional volumes added.

Even now, it should be recognized that the total of 65 titles means little, since the average personal library will not need each of the field guides listed, but would surely include one or more regional books recommended in the separate list. Obviously many fine and important books are missing; in some categories we offer merely a sampling of meritorious books. The list could easily be doubled.

This basic library list pays no regard to scarcity

or cost of the books listed; some are out of print but usually obtainable upon search (first try the publisher, then the book dealers, then advertise) and some can only be obtained at "rare book" prices. Books we believe to be out of print are followed by a † (dagger), books previously listed in full by one or more of the five current selectors are followed by an * (asterisk). — R.A.
