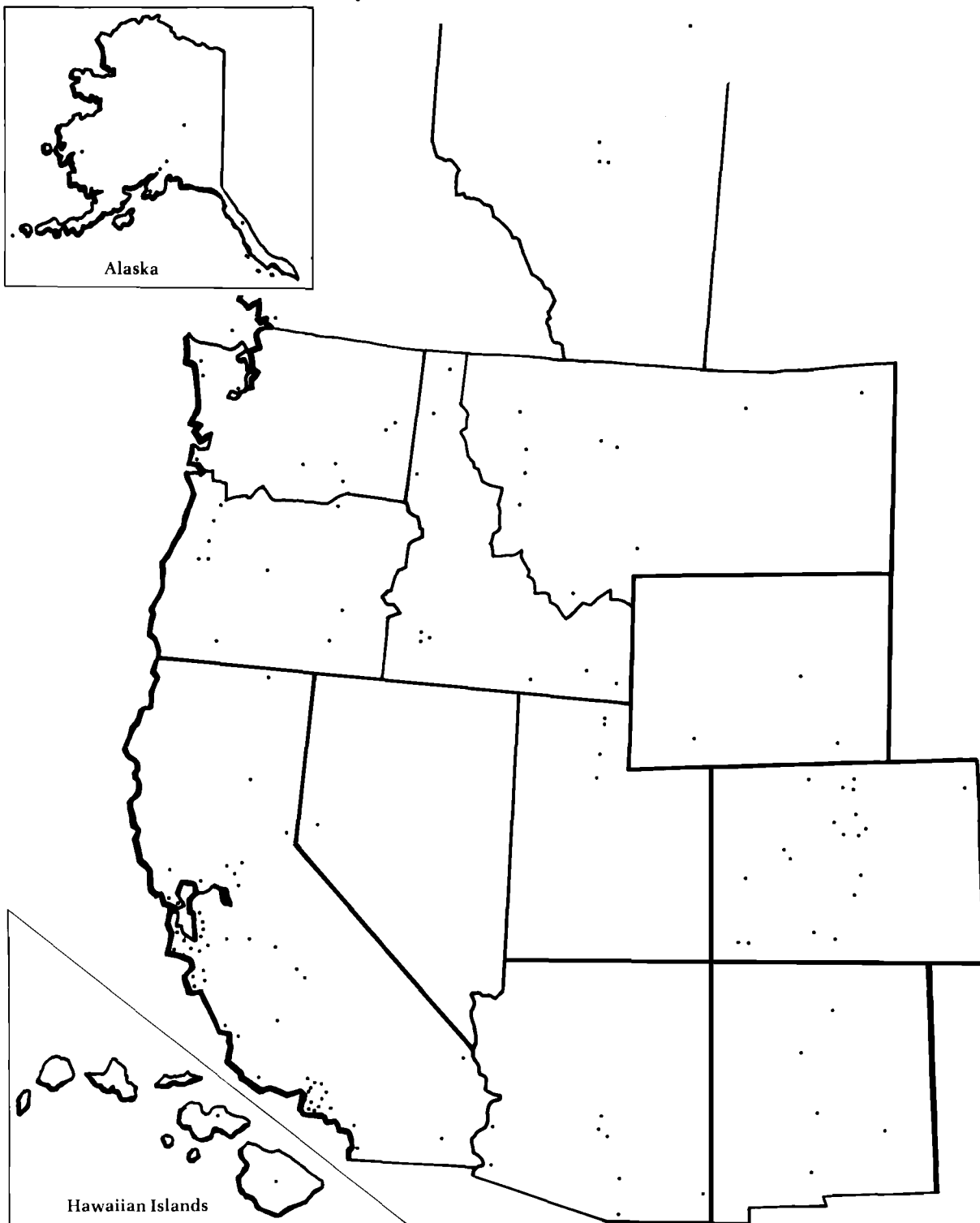

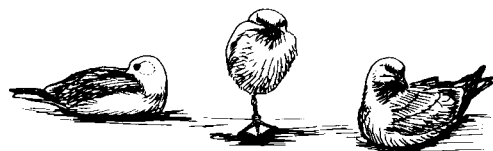

Commentary on the Annual Report

Van A. Truan

In 1975, 119,547 individual birds and 412 species were banded in W.B.B.A. territory. This represents the least number of birds banded in the past ten years. It was an 8 percent decrease from the 1974 total. Replies were received from 291 — 215 master banders and stations and/or agency permittees; 21 sub-permittees; and 55 reporting no birds banded in 1975. The banders, totalling 236, banded an average of 514 birds each. Alaska, Yukon, B.C., Alberta and California showed the only increases in individual birds banded in 1975.

Five new species were banded during 1975 in W.B.B.A. territory. They included five (5) Whoop-

ing Cranes, nine (9) Black Skimmers, ten (10) Black Guillemots, two (2) Parakeet Auklets, and two (2) Whiskered Auklets.

Hybrids banded in W.B.B.A. territory were: flicker (Red-shafted x Yellow-shafted) (8); Myrtle x Audubon's Warbler (2); Hermit x Townsend's Warbler (1). The Myrtle and Audubon's Warblers migrate commonly through Colorado, so it seems unusual that more hybrids are not banded; these are now considered to be one species — the Yellow-rumped Warbler.

were: Mallard — 18,189; Pintail — 11,153; Mourning Dove — 8,894; White-crowned Sparrow — 7,766; and Canada Goose — 6,582. These five species represent 44 percent of the total individuals banded.

Waterfowl accounted for 41 percent of all species banded; seedeaters (finches, sparrows, etc.), 21 percent; gulls and terns, 4 percent; and vireos and warblers, 3 percent. Thirty two (32) species, or 8 percent of the total species were represented by only one bird being banded.

Individuals with the highest number of species banded in 1975 were Allegra Collister (Colorado) with 104 species; Edgar T. Jones (Alberta) with 83 species; Kathryn Burk (Arizona) with 72 species; and Charles Corchran (Arizona) and Donald Payne (Oregon) with 70 species each.

Agency with the greatest species total was Point Reyes Bird Observatory, which had 128.

Greatest number of birds banded: *Individual banders* — J.C. Finley (Alberta), 2,438; Allegra Collister (Colorado), 2,195; Charles E. Corchran (Arizona), 2,057. *Agencies* — Colorado Div. of Wildlife, 20,377; Calif. Dept. of Fish & Game, 11,070; Point Reyes Bird Observatory, 5,980; Klamath Basin NWR, 4,428; and Utah Div. of Wildlife Resources, 4,109.

Special accomplishments: Raptors — 3,162 individuals of 33 species; Whooping Crane — 5. This latter is an introduced population, which we hope will become as common as certain other introduced species.

Individual species of birds banded which are worth noting are: 276 Ferruginous Hawks, 21 Gray Hawks, 240 Golden Eagles, 34 Gyrfalcons, 77 Peregrine Falcons, 105 Merlins, 9 Black Skimmers, and 17 Five-striped Sparrows.

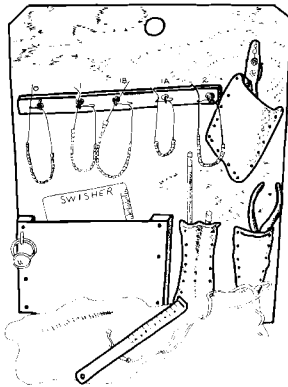
Bandings credited to Paul F. Springer should have been credited to his sub-permittee, William Shapeero.

McCamey Chickadee Trap: \$9.00 F.O.B. Eugene.

This trap is precision made and is designed to take birds the size of jays, grosbeaks, and cardinals. It is illustrated in EBBA Workshop Manual #5, 1975, p. 22.

It is sensitive to birds the size of chickadees and a 5 gram weight will trip the door. The main features are the sensitive treadle, a door lock for feeding when not activated, and a large handle for a gloved hand in winter. The back is fastened on with clips for easier access in case the treadle gets worked over by a squirrel.

Hundreds of these traps have been sold to nature schools, universities, and individuals in the States and Canada over the past ten years.

Packed individually, they weigh about three pounds and are shipped F.O.B. Eugene, Oregon via United Parcel. Order from Donald E. Payne, 34886 Mathews Road, Eugene, Oregon 97405.

Banding Pliers: These 6½" long-nose pliers have holes bored in the jaws to fit standard band sizes, so as to make it quite easy to get a perfect fit. This avoids the danger of lapped bands, which may injure the leg if not corrected, and which are troublesome to remove even with good tools. There is a split pin on the top of the plier which enables the user to open a band evenly with one operation. A spring on the side of the plier provides tension to keep the opened band in the plier while handling the bird. While new banders may welcome such pliers to increase their confidence in attaching the band, many experienced banders have shown interest in the pliers in order to handle birds more rapidly at peak times.

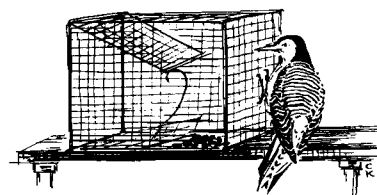
