ERRATUM

HOUSE FINCH DISEASE: A CALL FOR HELP

Since early 1994, bird watchers throughout much of the East have been noticing House Finches with red, swollen, crusty eyes. These birds have a respiratory disease caused by *Mycoplasma gallisepticum*, a bacterium that usually infects poultry. The disease poses no known risk to humans, but it can be fatal in finches. Sometimes the birds' eyes swell so much that they can't see, so they have a hard time finding food. They may starve or die from cold weather.

Some steps you can take to keep the disease from spreading:

Clean your bird feeders regularly--at least once at the start and again at the end of the winter feeding season--with mild bleach solution (one part bleach to nine parts water). Dry feeders well before filling them.

Prevent overcrowding by adding extra feeders to your yard (the disease spreads when birds are in close contact).

Report sick birds to your state wildlife agency.



Consider participating in the Cornell's Laboratory of Ornithology survey by watching your backyard feeders and record any House Finch visits. Note if you observe any disease symptoms.
